Explore Positional Words

Pre-K Math

Hi there! My name is Paige the Position Pig. This is my friend Sasha. She likes to play blocks! Where is she putting the block? Yes, **on top**. “On top” are positional words.



Positional words are all around us. We just have to look for them. Look at Suzy. Suzy is **under the umbrella. “Under” is a positional word, too!**



**Do you see Zeb?
Where is Zeb?
Yes, Zeb is *inside*
the slide.
“Inside” is a
positional word.
Have you been
inside a slide?
Are we inside
right now?**



Rebecca is hiding a gift from her grandmother. Where is Rebecca hiding the gift? Yes, she is hiding the gift **behind** her back. "Behind" is a positional word.



Kahlil and Feisal were playing in the rain, and now they are standing out of the rain. Kahlil and Feisal are standing **beside one another. “Beside” is a positional word.**



**Look at
Jasmine's
family. They are
sitting **outside**
of their house.
“Outside” is a
positional word.
Do you like to
go outside?**



Jack is getting on the bus first. Jack is **in front** of Mei. "In front of" are positional words. The line leader also stands in front of the other friends in the line.



Look at Vaida.
Vaida is jumping
over the
sprinkler.
“Over” is a
positional word.
Have you tried
to jump over
something?



This is Anita and her sister, Norah. Who is **in between** Anita and her sister? Yes, Anita's mom is in between them. "In between" are positional words.



Look at Scott!
Scott's teacher
is helping him
trace around
his hand.
“Around” is a
positional word.



Hands-On: Have students act out the positional words they learned in the book: inside, on top, between, outside, over, in front of, beside, under, behind, and around. For example, one student can stand “behind” a friend. One student can crawl “under” the table. One student can sit “on top of” the chair.



Engage Thinking: As the students explore the positional words, check in with them by having them restate what the word is. You can challenge the students by whispering a positional word to the student acting it out. The remaining students will guess the word.
